ENGLISH and WELSH

As Linguists we will continue to develop our speaking, listening and reading skills through stories, songs and Fflic a Fflac stories. We will learn language patterns through 'Ffa La La' songs. Puffins will take part in a Pori Drwy Stori rhyme challenge. We will be focusing on phonics skills through RWI in Puffins and develop oracy and imagination through story dough in Pufflings. In Puffins, we will experience a range of stories and encourage imagination in 'Drawing Club.' We will develop our writing skills through dough disco and Penpals, and begin simple sentence writing using Mr

MATHEMATICS & NUMERACY

As Mathematicians we will continue to develop our skills in a practical manner. We will look at counting, reciting and singing number songs with numbers to 5 for Pufflings. Puffins will continue to develop our understanding of composition, subitising and addition this time using number to ten. We will continue to use 2D and 3D shapes within our play, using large blocks to support. We will develop our understanding of length, height and time through practical activities as well as continuing our work on mass and capacity. We will develop our number formation, supported with practical activities.

RVE

We will develop our understanding of rules, linked to our class charter which we created together. We will develop a sense of ourselves in the context of friends and families and begin to recognise that we are all different and that is what makes us special. We will continue to develop our understanding of acceptance and look at how we can overcome challenges. We will develop our understanding of special celebrations including Pancake day, Easter and Mother's Day.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

We will continue to develop our wellbeing journey through mindfulness practice and daily 'Mini – me' yoga sessions where we will learn poses and breathing techniques to help us be calm, focused and energized! We will focus on fundamental movement skills and follow 'Real PE' in our Puffins PE sessions. Our Jigsaw topic will be 'Healthy Me' where we will discuss the importance of exercise and healthy eating.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

There will be lots of opportunities to develop observational skills this term! The children will be encouraged to follow instructions when making pancakes, carefully observing changes to materials and describing what they can see. The children will also have the opportunity to use a range of tools and materials with growing independence in their art and craft work. The children explore and discuss the melting process.

HUMANITIES

We are very curious in Pufflings and Puffins and this topic will encourage us to ask questions to find out things within our school and local community. We will be encouraging children to ask questions of visitors and listen carefully to their answers. We will be given opportunities to explore and discover facts, stories and artefacts linked to our Welsh culture and local community.

EXPRESSIVEARTS

We love to be creative and will be exploring and experimenting! This term we will develop our textiles skills through simple sewing to create Easter decorations.

As musicians we will develop our understanding
