racism

when someone is treated **unfairly** or **unkindly** because of their **race, skin colour, culture, or where their family comes from**

protest

to complain and speak out against something you disagree with in an organised way

boycott

when **people protest by refusing to buy or use something or go somewhere**, to bring about a change

activist

a person who feels passionately about something and **wants to make a change**

civil rights

the rights that belong to every person: the American Civil Rights Movement was a movement that fought for equal rights for black people

campaigns

planned actions to achieve a goal

natural history

the study of **plants and animals** (which involves science too)

born in Wales in 1934 and a community activist who became the first black headteacher in Wales

Betty Campbell

“each person must live their life as a model for others”



born in the USA in 1913 and known as the “mother of the Civil Rights Movement” for refusing to give up her seat on a public bus

Rosa Parks

“I have a dream”



born in the USA in 1929, going on to lead the American Civil Rights Movement

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

“one child, one teacher, one pen and one book can change the world”



born in Pakistan in 1997 and stood up for a girl's right to attend school

Malala Yousafzai

“the future of humanity and indeed all life on Earth depends on us”



born in the UK in 1926 and a British wildlife broadcaster who speaks out about protecting the world

Sir David Attenborough

“the difference between [a] child's life being a little bit better or not [is] ultimately a small amount of funding”



born in Wales in 1969 and an actor who uses his platform to campaign against social injustices
